

### For loved one who is sick

As a gesture you may wish to make the Sign of the Cross on the photograph as you say the following:

Give strength to your servant who is sick and needs your care. Show mercy, Lord, and send your powerful help.

### A prayer for a loved one who is in isolation in hospital.

Lord Jesus, as you suffered on the Cross, your Mother and friends could only stand at a distance unable to help you. In our helplessness we ask for strength to help us through this time. Look on the one we love who is sick, out of our reach never out of our care, beyond our embrace, never beyond your power. A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 14:1-6

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me. There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you. I am going now to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too. You know the way to the place where I am going. Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going so how can we know the way?' Jesus said: 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me.'

Say this prayer of Commendation Into your hands, Lord, I commend N., in faith that you will raise him/her up, in hope that you we shall be together again in you, In love that does not die. I give thanks for having known and loved him/her and I pray that N.'s life will continue to inspire me to love and to be of help to others. Welcome into paradise your servant where he/she may enjoy that place prepared for him/her for ever and ever. Amen.
