Who are we?

- We are 152 separate Parish Communities, grouped together into 19 Partnerships, within 5 Episcopal Areas
- With an area of 3195 square miles, our boundaries are the border with Scotland in the North and the River Tees in the south
- In the North and West, we have rural communities which are sparsely populated and with limited access to some services. The South and East are urban and more densely populated, with relatively better access to services
- The region's population is 2,368,000, with an estimated Catholic population of 214,257
- We have 128 Primary, 2 Infant, 2 Junior, 3 First, 1 Middle, and 20 Secondary Schools, with 54,190 pupils
- All 156 schools will be within 4 Catholic Education Trusts by Autumn 2022

Job Description

To provide cleaning and laundry services in the parish house.

Main duties

- Cleaning in the parish house including mopping, vacuum cleaning, dusting and polishing
- Ensure the kitchen is kept clean, tidy and in an orderly manner at all times
- Ensure the bathroom and toilets are kept clean and tidy
- Ensure that all hard floors are cleaned and kept safe, using the appropriate non-slip cleaning fluids
- Laundry and ironing, as required
- Emptying bins
- Adhere to COSHH and health and safety regulations
- Be fully acquainted and comply with all security procedures and policies and ensure that these are followed at all times
- Maintain strict confidentiality at all times
- Undertake other reasonable duties by request of the line manager

What skills and experience do you need to apply?

You must have:

- Experience of general cleaning
- Experience of ironing to a good standard
- A commitment to achieving a high standard of cleanliness
- The ability to work as part of a team as well as on own initiative
- A high level of confidentiality and integrity
- Good inter-personal skills to communicate with a range of people
- A good understanding of basic Health and Safety Regulations, including COSHH

The successful candidate must be conscientious and loyal to the aims and objectives of the Diocese, having regard at all times to its Catholic character

What will we offer you?

- Salary: £4,151.68 per annum and a workplace pension scheme where we match up to a maximum of 7.5% of your salary
