St. John of the Cross: A Journey from Darkness into Light, absence to presence, through the Cross to Resurrection.

Bishop Terry first spoke to the Newman Circle shortly after his appointment to the diocese. His subject at that time was St Teresa of Avila and her writings on the Christian soul's journey to God. Juan de Yepes y Álvarez was mentored by and corresponded with St Teresa and is also known for his writings, particularly the Spiritual Canticle written during his imprisonment and torture.

"Madonna House' Spirituality: more than meets the eye"

The spirituality of Madonna House grew from their foundress's trials and hardships in Russia at the turn of the century and experiences which led to her strong faith and love of God. A community grew around her which aspired to a way of life expressed as her 'Little Mandate from God'."

Fr Currer is a Parish priest in the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle. He has further responsibility with the Pontifical council for Promoting Christian Unity and attends meetings in Rome in this regard, earning him an early nickname "Our man at the Vatican". The talk will focus on Christian Unity
